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2. GRADING MARKS

- 2.1. Grading marks are in numerical percent with 75% as the passing mark in all subjects; however there should be no failing grade below 65%.
- 2.2. Grades shall not be computed on the basis of any transmutation table that equates zero to a pre-selected base (such as 50 or 70) and adjusts other scores accordingly.
- 2.3. Scores shall be recorded as raw scores, totaled at the end of each grading period and then computed as percentage (i.e. [student's score ÷ highest possible score] x 100).
